Dear Students and Parents,

Even though we are just starting to get into the rhythm of summer, we want to provide you with some important information for the 2024-2025 school year.

The school year will begin on Wednesday, August 14, 2024. On this day, <u>freshmen</u> will have a full day, 8:00 a.m. to 3:00p.m. <u>Transfer students</u> will attend an orientation session from 8:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. On Thursday, August 15, all students will report by 8:00 a.m.

Everyone is asked to pick up class schedules on Wednesday, August 7, between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Schedule changes will only be made for academic reasons and must be approved by the Director of Academic Development. The band and guard will be holding a Used Uniform Sale during these hours or until the merchandise is gone. The Spirit Shop will be open that day for the purchase of spirit wear and the 1/4 zip uniform pullover.

Due to security enhancements being implemented over the summer, all students <u>must</u> wear their picture ID on a lanyard at all times. This card will be used as a debit card to purchase lunch, check out textbooks from the bookstore, and can be used for admittance at all home athletic events. Returning students will have their badges ready on the first day of school using pictures from last school year. However, ALL <u>new</u> students must have their picture taken on August 7 during schedule pick up. All students who drive to school will need to purchase a parking pass. Information on this process was sent to students via email earlier in the summer.

We would like to remind you that **before your student can get his/her schedule you will need to access your Family Portal** to complete the enrollment/re-enrollment process. You should have received information regarding this to the email address you provided Archbishop Carroll High School. Any questions should be directed to ndruck@carrollhs.org.

### UNIFORM INFORMATION

Archbishop Carroll High School uses Shaheen's Uniform Store as the sole provider of uniforms for our students. Students can continue wearing the Land's End uniforms for as long as they fit and are in good condition. Only uniforms purchased through Shaheen's or previously purchased through Lands' End will be permitted and all items must be embroidered with the proper Carroll logos.

The annual <u>used</u> uniform sale will be held on schedule pick-up day, August 7, 2024. More details will be coming about that event over the summer. We will once again be selling the Carroll uniform crewneck sweatshirt in the Spirit Shop. Students may wear the crewneck or a ½ zip pullover purchased from the Spirit Shop or Shaheen's <u>over</u> the uniform polo shirt. Below are the details you'll need to order uniforms from Shaheen's:

### THE ARCHBISHOP CARROLL DRESS CODE

Archbishop Carroll students are expected to be dressed in a neat and presentable manner at all times. Students should dress in a manner in which they can take pride in as a representative of Archbishop Carroll High School. The administration reserves the right to require any student dressed inappropriately to change before attending classes or to leave a school sponsored activity. Uniforms must be purchased from Sheehan Uniform Company and have the Archbishop Carroll logo properly adorned.

<u>PERSONAL APPEARANCE STANDARDS</u> - Students should be dressed appropriately to maintain a professional appearance and maintain Catholic values of modesty through their dress.

- 1. Extremes in hairstyle (and color), jewelry, make-up and attire are not permitted.
- 2. Tattoos (body art) must be covered during the school day.
- 3. Any head covering hats, scarves, bandannas should be removed while in the building.
- 4. Facial hair is prohibited during all school hours regardless of whether the student is in uniform or not.
- 5. No facial piercings, mouth piercings or gauges in ears. Small studs in the nose are acceptable.
- 6. Hair must be neat, clean, pulled up and off the collar (for boys), out of the face, and appropriate for an internship interview.

# <u>DAILY DRESS CODE</u> - STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO FOLLOW THE DRESS CODE DURING SCHOOL HOURS. A STUDENT NOT FOLLOWING THE CODE IS CONSIDERED IN UNIFORM VIOLATION.

- 1. Uniform pants or shorts worn at the waist. Female students may wear the approved skort, which must fall BELOW fingertip length.
- 2. The length of uniform shorts/skorts cannot be altered or rolled, and CHS logo must be visible.
- 3. Red or blue polo shirt with the Carroll logo **MUST** be worn at all times **under ALL** approved tops. Polo shirts may be worn so that the length does not fall below the bottom of the pockets of the uniform pants. Shirts longer than the approved length must be tucked in. Shirts may only have one button undone.
- 4. Carroll uniform tops purchased through the approved uniform company or in the approved Spirit Shop section may be worn over uniform polo shirts. The collar of the polo must be visible. Polo shirts cannot hang outside the bottom of the approved top. <u>Approved tops:</u>
- a. Carroll Block Letter crew neck sweatshirts
- b. Carroll Logo quarter zips
- c. Plain Solid color (navy, white, red, blue, gray, black) knit sweaters
- 5. Gym or dress shoes (in good repair) are the ONLY approved foot wear. Socks must be worn.
- 6. All students **MUST** wear/have on their person, the new school issued student ID. This ID will serve as a student badge system for entry to the school building during school hours. There will be a \$25.00 fee for lost/replaced ID's.
- 7. Boys may wear a solid color shirt and tie with a plain t-shirt underneath.

Any student not in compliance with the uniform code will be issued a demerit for each violation that day or may be sent home to dress in the appropriate uniform. Students sent home to change are responsible for work missed.

#### **OUT OF UNIFORM DRESS CODE**

- 1 Students may wear: jeans, shorts, skirts, capris or pants in good repair and worn at the waist. No rips or holes may be visible.
- 2. Girls may wear leggings, as long as they are SOLID BLACK, (no other color allowed) and the proper top is worn with them as to be considered an appropriate length such as "tunic length".
- 3. No short shorts, spandex, pajama bottoms, swim trunks or short skirts (shorts and skirts are to be longer than ("Finger-tip" length).
- 4. No tank tops, halter tops or straps showing.
- 5. Shoulders must be covered at all times.
- 6. Shirts must be of a length that can be tucked in
- 7. No low-cut shirts or low-cut V-necks (no more than 2 inches below the collarbone.)
- 8. No hats or headgear of any kind.
- 9. No clothing related to alcohol or tobacco or having foul language or sexual messages.
- 10. Heavy coats and head coverings (including hoods) must be removed and placed in the student's locker upon entering the building at any time.
- 11. Undergarments must not be visible
- 12. In the second semester, seniors are permitted to wear college shirts with uniform bottoms on Wednesday. No college athletic jerseys may be worn.

### SPIRIT DAY DRESS CODE (FRIDAYS ONLY)

- 1 Approved issued school pants, shorts, or skorts
- 2. Archbishop Carroll attire that is predominantly red, white, gray, black, pink and /or royal blue.
- 3. Archbishop Carroll approved athletic tops are permitted.
- 4. Archbishop Carroll sponsored athletic and club shirts
- 5. Archbishop Carroll gear purchased in the spirit shop
- 6. Shirts that recognize school accomplishments (i.e. OHSAA tournament t-shirts)
- 7. On House Shirt days, uniform pants, shorts & skorts will be required and only House Shirts or uniform shirts may be worn.

Dear Patriots and Parents:

As Athletic Director at Archbishop Carroll High School, I would like to welcome everyone back to another exciting year of Archbishop Carroll High School Athletics! For those new to our family, welcome to the home of the **PATRIOTS!** Our faculty, administration and coaching staff are very excited about the opportunity to work with you in these all-important high school years. A number of you have chosen to be involved with athletic teams while at Carroll. The following information outlines requirements to participate, including academic eligibility, athletic forms, conditioning times for fall sports, and fall tryout information.

**OHSAA PRE-SEASON PARENT MEETING:** The OHSAA requires a mandatory meeting for parents prior to the start of each season. The meeting for all Fall sports will be held on Monday, August 5, 2024. The meeting will begin at 6:00 PM in the school cafeteria. Topics covered will include, eligibility; school policies regarding athletics; and state regulations.

**ATHLETIC FORMS:** Students planning on participating in interscholastic athletics are required to have a valid OHSAA Pre-Participation Physical Form on file in the athletic office. Students, along with their Parent/Guardian, will also need to complete and electronically sign required athletic forms. The forms may be found in a student's FinalForms account.

An OHSAA Pre-Participation Physical Exam Form may be downloaded from a student's FinalForms account under the "Forms" tab. Please bring the physical form with you to your physical appointment. Physicals are valid for one calendar year, with a grace period of one month for insurance purposes. The two pages of the physical form the doctor completes and signs are the only hard copies that need to be on file with the Athletic Office. These two pages may be uploaded to a student's FinalForms account or turned in to the Athletic Office.

**FOOTBALL:** The Carroll Football team has recently begun their summer practices. It is not too late to join the team. In order to be eligible, students need to pass at least five one-credit courses or the equivalent (each of which count toward graduation). **ATHLETIC PARTICIPATION FEES:** First sport is \$200.00, second sport is \$185.00, and third sport is \$170.00. There is a family maximum of \$700.00. Participation fees will be added to your tuition statement once a team has been established.

# **Lunch Accounts**

### New Cafeteria Payment Portal for 2024-2025

Starting June 12, 2024, WG Grinders Cafeteria Operations will partner with Meal Magic to manage our lunch service software and online payments. Our previous provider, Myschoolaccount.com, sold their software and payment system to Meal Magic. The myschoolaccount.com payment portal will no longer be able to take payments after June 6, 2024. The new payment portal will not begin taking payments until June 12, 2024. This will allow WG Grinders Cafeteria Operations time to transfer all balances to the new software.

On the back of this letter is an information sheet that will guide you through the setup process. The Family Portal for Meal Magic is very user-friendly and will allow you to transfer funds between siblings, set daily spending limits, and limit the purchase of certain items.

Note: Any money that was left on your child's account at the end of the school year will show up on your on your child's account for the next school year automatically. There is nothing that you need to do for this to happen.

### What is Meal Magic Family Portal?

Meal Magic Family Portal combines features that previously were available elsewhere but required you to visit multiple websites. Now, all food service activity can be accessed through a single site.

You can use Family Portal to view balances, see account and purchase histories, make deposits, transfer money among family members, set parental controls, apply for meal benefits, complete household information reports, and order meals. Some schools might not offer all of these features.

### **Registration Tips**

Before registering, add \*.familyportal.cloud as a safe domain email sender in your email app. If you think you did not receive an email, try looking in your spam folder. If it's there, be sure to mark it as safe for future email messages.

If you get a message about not being able to access your account, try using the I forgot my passphrase option under My Account.

### Registering (Creating an Account)

Each school district has its own Family Portal web address. You will need to create an account at each one you need to access. Our portal address is wggrinders.familyportal.cloud

Registering an account has two parts. In the first part, you will be asked to enter your email address and agree to the site's Terms of Use and Privacy Policy, after which an email will be sent to you.

Email is sent to confirm that you have access to the address you used. If you click the link that is in the email, you will be returned to Family Portal to complete the second part of registration, which entails entering your real name and setting a passphrase to protect your account.

Registrations must be completed within 20 minutes. If you take too long, you will need to click the I need to unlock my account option.

- 1. Click My Account.
- 2. Click I need to register as a Family Portal user.
- 3. Enter your email address for the Username.
- 4. Click Next.
- 5. Read and Accept the Terms of Use and Privacy Policy.
- 6. Check your email for activation instructions.
- 7. Click the link in the activation email.
- Enter your first and last name and set a passphrase.
- 9. Click Submit.

## **Important Note About Passphrases**

A passphrase is like a password but usually is longer and has fewer restrictions on format. Your passphrase will be tested against a database of passwords known to have been compromised on other websites and will be rejected if a match is found.

For security, **never** use the same passphrase on more than one website, and **never** share your passphrase with anyone, including your district or our support team. Treat it as highly confidential.

### My Account

After successfully completing registration, you will use My Account whenever you want to access your account.

If you have forgotten your passphrase, enter your Username and click I forgot my passphrase.

# Adding Family Members / Pending Approvals

When logged into Family Portal, you will have the ability to add family members to your account by using the **Add Person** button. Minimally,

you will need to know the ID Number assigned by the school to the person along with the person's first and last name. There will be no need to add a prefix to the ID numbers as in past years.

Before you can access information for a person attached to your account, your school district must approve your access to them. Once approved, you will be able to see balances, settings, and histories.

### **Removing Family Members**

To remove a family member using a smart device, swipe left on the member's name and then click the trashcan icon. On a PC, hover your mouse over the name to reveal the trashcan.

### **Adding Money for Family Members**

When you are logged into your account, click the **Deposit** button when you want to add money for family members. Enter an amount for each person you want to give money and then click **Check-Out** to see your payment options. Click the payment method you want to use, provide the requested information, and click the **Pay** button.

## Transfer Money, See History, Change Settings

Touch or click a family member on the **My Account** page if you want to transfer money from that person to another on your account, or if you want to view account history including purchases, or if you want to set parental controls (if allowed by the district).

### Low-Balance Reminder Email

If you would like to receive email notifications when a family member's account balance is running low, click the Notifications button on the My Account screen. Uncheck the first box if it is checked, and then check the second box. Set a dollar amount (\$0, \$5, \$10, \$15, \$20 ... up to \$50). An email will be sent when a balance reaches or goes below the amount you set. Reminders repeat every three days as necessary.

You must contact your school if you have questions about your family members. Money does not flow through Meal Magic Corporation. You must contact your district about duplicate payments, refunds, or anything related to account balances. Each school district is independent of others and, therefore, is unable to transfer balances to other school districts.

For your protection, no credit card or banking information is stored by Meal Magic Family Portal.


